<p><b>1. Welcome</b></p> <p>Carol Robertson welcomed everyone to the second half of the evening's activities.</p>	
<p><b>2. Declarations of Interest</b></p> <p>No declarations of interest.</p>	
<p><b>3. Adoption of Previous Minutes</b></p> <p>Fiona Berrow proposed; Ashleigh Phillip seconded.</p>	
<p><b>4. Matters Arising from previous minutes not to be addressed within the meeting</b></p> <p>There is continued correspondence with Brian Roberts following his attendance at the May RCC meeting, covering seven issues raised. It was agreed to add giant hogweed to the list of issues to be addressed.</p>	<p>CR and CRogers to follow up</p>
<p><b>3. Reports</b></p> <p>a. <b>Secretary</b>        Fiona Dyet added that there was had been no police report; SB said to let him know if no police officer attends a RCC meeting, and he can get a report.</p> <p>b. <b>Treasurer</b></p> <p>c. <b>Planning</b>  <b>Street Name:</b> AR has sent all details to Gillian Rutherford at Stirling Council regarding Forthside Way.</p>	

<p><b>6. Subgroups</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. <b>Accessibility:</b> GA to put together a sheet on the markings at the various new crossings throughout Riverside. GA also encouraged residents to use FixMyStreet for any issues, particularly giant hogweed. Cllr Nunn will clarify whether the spraying of hogweed is reliant upon reports from residents.</li> <li>b. <b>Website:</b> It was agreed to look for a different provider for the RCC website.</li> <li>c. <b>Community Enhancement:</b> The plant sale went well, raising over £600. The next step is to decide what the money should be used on – potentially including building a community library on the space where the phone box stood at the end of Millar Place. Cllr Nunn suggested looking at Scotland’s Garden Scheme for future plant sales.</li> <li>d. <b>Shore Road Park:</b> RCC still waiting for the boulders for the park.</li> <li>e. <b>Defibrillators:</b> All defibs have new pads and are set to go for the next 2 years.</li> <li>f. <b>OHW:</b> A session sowing wildflower on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> June, 10:30-13:30; meet at the pillars.</li> <li>g. <b>Planters:</b> CR looking for one more volunteer for the final planter and also seeking four breeze blocks to replace some removed during recent road works.</li> <li>h. <b>Roads:</b> PM and AF waiting to hear from Stirling Council regarding parking on Roseberry Terrace and Forth Street. AR has continued concerns regarding improper use of zigzag lines in the recent roadworks. He also raised his concern about the continued removal of mini roundabouts by Stirling Council, most recently near the Vue cinema.</li> <li>i. <b>Local Groups:</b> Riverside Primary Summer Fair, Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June. 18:00-20:30. <p><b>7. A.O.B.</b> CR commented on the continued poor state of Lovers Walk, as there has been no resolution to the fencing issues or bird poo. Cllr Nunn suggested contacting the local MP rather than MSP to progress conversation with Network Rail but confirmed that the path is Stirling Council’s responsibility.</p>
